

Ready To Learn

The mission of the Community Idea Stations' Ready To Learn program is to prepare children for success in school through the reach of Public Broadcasting. Ready To Learn has an impact! Studies show that after attending a Ready To Learn workshop:

- Parents become better television gatekeepers for their children.
- Families spend more time together reading and doing other education-related activities.
- Families make more frequent trips to libraries and bookstores.

The objectives of Ready To Learn are to:

1. empower parents to become their child's first teacher,
2. promote healthy television viewing habits, and
3. instill a literacy mindset among families and caregivers.

The Community Idea Stations' Ready To Learn program provides services to thousands of children and their families. These services include the following:

- ***PBS Kids Award-Winning Programs*** – The Community Idea Stations broadcasts over twelve hours each weekday of commercial-free, **educational** children's television programming.
- ***Workshops*** – In the past year, The Community Idea Stations Ready To Learn staff provided 193 workshops for parents, childcare providers, and early childhood professionals impacting over 17,000 children. Our workshops focus on using television as a learning tool and are based on the Ready To Learn View, Do, Read learning triangle. That encourages parents and caregivers to view quality children's television programs with their children, read books to their children related to some theme in the show, and do activities with their children related to the theme.
- ***Special projects*** – The Community Idea Stations sponsors special projects and events periodically throughout the year to encourage reading. We have partnered with libraries, museums, bookstores, hospitals, and other literacy partners to help foster a love of stories and reading. The *Reading Rainbow Young Writers and Illustrators Contest* is a favorite.

- ***Children's Book Distributions*** – Each adult attending a Ready To Learn workshop receives a free children's book. We also work with our literacy partners to distribute books on a monthly basis throughout the school year. In the past year, we distributed over 15,000 free new books to children in our viewing area.
- ***PBS Supporting Publications and Websites*** – The Ready To Learn staff distributes PBS related materials at workshops. These materials offer child growth and development information and additional activities to improve literacy skills. The Community Idea Stations' website also links to PBS Kids, PBS Parents, and PBS Teacher Source websites.

Ready To Learn is committed to fulfilling the education goal that all children will attend school ready to learn. To achieve this goal, The Community Idea Stations' Ready To Learn staff offers workshop that combine books, exciting, interactive hands-on activities, and educational television. Each workshop features:

- Video clips – to highlight selected segments of PBS programming that will illustrate its curricular goals.
- Training – to help parents, early childhood educators, or childcare providers use media effectively in the learning environment.
- Activities – to develop educational experiences that will extend the learning introduced in the PBS programming.
- Literacy tips – to encourage the use of books as a means for developing language skills, social skills, and a love of learning through reading.

The workshops offered are:

“View, Do, READ!” (Overview Workshop)

Ready to Learn's “View, Do, and Read” learning model is introduced to the audience as a way to combine selective television viewing **with activities** that stimulate creative learning and reading age-appropriate books. General information about PBS KIDS programs and *Ready To Learn* is included in this participatory workshop. ALL AUDIENCES.

Making the Most of Screen Time

This informative workshop is designed to teach the audience about media literacy and the effects it has on young children. Video clips will be viewed and participants will investigate the various
